A Word from the Parish Priest




The most solemn and sacred week of the Church's year begins today. It is a time to place our faith at the top of our list of priorities. I often observe the way in which members of other religions and religious groups give huge effort and time to the practice of their faith, and to the works associated with them. We have the immense privilege of the fullness of the truth and the most privileged way of worshipping God, as he established and as he desires. And yet, we can be half-hearted in our practice even in the holy season of Lent and even in a Jubilee Year. And so, I am asking all of you to come and take part in the liturgies, devotions and times of prayer

that are available to you in our parish this year. Even is you are not accustomed to come to the great liturgies of the Easter Triduum, come this year!

I have observed a real downturn in the number of people coming specifically to the liturgy on Good Friday. This used to be a day when Church was packed, but not so any longer. We have adapted ourselves to the way of the world around us. Although it is a Bank Holiday, it is like any other day to most people. Let's make a stand for our Crucified Lord this Good Friday and make

coming to Church a priority. There is the traditional 3pm liturgy at St Joseph's but also at 6pm at English Martyrs'. There is a family friendly Stations at 12noon at St Joseph's too.

We should also make the Easter Vigil a priority. This year we will be welcoming new people into the Church, and celebrating the sacraments of initiation. Let's welcome them by accompanying them! The Vigil Mass is quite different from Easter Sunday Mass. So, why not come along to both and really exalt the Risen Christ by our participation. I invite you to come also to the retreat evenings at St Patrick's Monday to Wednesday to prepare for the solemn days of the Triduum. I feel that this Holy Week is going to be a great time of grace for our parish. Be part of it!



Pope St Martin I (d. 655)

St Martin was a Basilian monk and abbot, and had a history of great service to the Church. He had represented to Pope in Dalmatia, alleviating the distress of people there who had been persecuted. He was legate to Constantinople when that city dominated the Roman Empire. He

was elected Pope in 649 and served for six years. He was very decisive in his Papacy. He opposed the heresy, supported by the Emperor, of Christ only have one divine will, and no human will. He was arrested and banished first to Greece and then to Crimea. He acquiesced to being deprived of the Papacy and died in exile.
