A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Looking back, I think this year's Christmas celebrations were very beautiful and well supported in our Parish. Thanks once again to everyone who helped with all the tasks required to make this so. Now we are back into Ordinary Time, and life has returned to normal.

As we start this New Year, there are new initiatives in the Parish. As part of their Confirmation preparation the children in the top class in each of our three schools are doing a Prayer & Life Workshop for children each week. I am also giving an adult's workshop near Derby, to which 44 people turned up for the introductory session. We will be offering the PLW for adults in our parish in the near future, so watch out for that!

We also have our first proper meeting of the new Parish Pastoral Forum on Monday this week, so I hope many parishioners will come and participate in the forum, which is a bit like a parish Council but with the emphasis on the pastoral life of the Parish. Please come along!

As well as this Catholic forum for our united Parish, we are also part of Biddulph Churches Together (nowadays called CTST8). Since its inception, our congregation has been represented by Mrs Tess Hall, who has put a lot of effort into so many projects together with the other Christian churches of Biddulph. Tess has decided to retire from the position of Church representative. It would be good to have a volunteer who would carry on this work of representing us (together with me) at the meetings.

You will see I have put a

notice about votive candles on the bulletin, relating to St Joseph's. However, please read this, because it has important directions for health and safety, so that we can light our votives safely.

Next Sunday is the Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis nominated this Sunday as the day on which Catholics can celebrate, but also assess, the role of the Bible, the Word of God, in our lives. It would be great if we could heed the call of the Church to know the Word of God better. Maybe the introduction of the new lectionary at Mass could be an impetus to help to urge us towards this goal.

Please continue to pray for our new catechumens who are preparing for baptism, and also for those preparing to be received into the Church and confirmed.

Saint of the Week



St Wulstan 1008-1095

St Wulstan was born in Warwickshire, and became a monk of Evesham and then Peterborough. After ordination to the priest-hood he moved to be a monk at Worcester. He became the treasurer, and then the Prior of the monastery. He was then named as Bishop of Worcester in

1062. After the Norman invasion in 1066, Wulstan showed such competence as Bishop that he was the only Anglo-Saxon Bishop to keep his post. He was responsible for the rebuilding of the Cathedral, but always had a care for the poor and sought to alleviate the harsh treatment of Saxons by the Normans. He was canonised in 1203.

Mary's Meals Many thanks to all our parishioners for their generosity in supporting our Christmas crib appeal for Mary's Meals once again this year. The cash amount donated was £4,534, of which £2.080 was Gift Aided, making our effective contribution £5,054. The matched funding was already allocated prior to the end of our appeal, so there is no match funding this year. However, this is a tremendous effort and a wonderful amount of support for our annual Christmas crib charity. It represents 264 children who will be fed each day in a place of education, thanks to our parishioners.

Votive candles at St Joseph's For two reasons, all votive candles have been removed from the votive candle stands. We have noticed that a lot of candles were being lit and not paid for. Also, children were lighting the candles unattended and, therefore, not safely. Please buy the candles as you enter church. Payment can be in cash or on the card reader. 24 hour votives are £1 and the small 2 hour votives are 20p. Please use a taper to light the candles, and do not light one from another, which risks burning and falling hot wax. Children must be supervised. Please place lit candles at the top of the stand so people don't have to reach across lit candles risking burns. Thanks for your care.

Red Mission Boxes Now is the time to bring all your mission boxes to church so that they can be emptied. Please help our volunteers by bringing them to the church at which they were issued. Thank you!

Solemnity of Our Lady of Grace Our Parish's Patronal Feast Day in honour of Our Lady of Grace falls on 7th February each year. 
