Saint of the Week



St Charles of Sezze 1613-1670

Charles is an Italian saint was born into a poor family and became a shepherd. He wanted to be a priest but could barely read or write. And so he was accepted as a lay Franciscan brother and was dedicated to doing the menial tasks, such as cooking, gardening and as a porter. He would

also go out begging on the streets. He never sought his own advancement. He had a mystical experience in 1648 when a ray of light from the host at Mass pierced his side and left a visible wound. He had other visions. People came to him for spiritual advice, including Pope Clement IX whom he visited on his deathbed.

Epiphany Proclamation of the Moveable Feasts for 2025: Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Saviour. On the fifth day of March will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season. On the twentieth day of April you will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the twenty-ninth day of May will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. On the eighth day of June, the feast of Pentecost. On the twenty-second day of the same month, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On the thirtieth day of November, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Safeguarding & Health & Safety Please ensure that children remain safe at all times around our churches. Would all parents and guardians ob-

serve the following norms.

- 1. Children should be accompanied at all times around the church property. They should be accompanied if they go to the toilet (this is especially true at English Martyrs' and St Patrick's where the toilets are at the back of church, and not observable from the body of the church.
- 2. Please also ensure that children do not run around in church at any time, either during Mass or afterwards. There are a lot of things they can collide with, such as votive candle stands, hot radiators, pews...
- 3. Please ensure that children are properly supervised lighting votive candles. Everyone should use the tapers provided and not light one candle from another. Do not reach across lighted candles to place a candle on the stand. Remember that most coats etc are made of highly flammable materials.


