A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

Today marks the 13th anniversary of the beginning of my pastoral ministry in the parish as Parish Priest. In many ways it has flown by, though it also seems like a long time. Thinking back, the parish has changed somewhat. one thing, it is now one rather than three parishes. The community around us has also changed significantly, especially looking at the make-up of the congregation at St Joseph's. It is a much more diverse parish with many more people from other nations and ethnicities. There are also different challenges which emerge. Engaging the Catholic families who have been here for generations with the Faith is a particular difficulty, and many have practically given up the Catholic Faith, or are strangers to Mass and the Sacraments. But then

there are those who come into our community from far away, but whom we do not find it easy to engage in the life of the Parish beyond the Mass. In the middle of all the change we need the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and also the awareness of difficulties and the need to respond to the situation.

One thing that we have begun recently is the Parish Forum. We started in the winter, and then have our second meeting coming soon. Please come to the meeting whether you came before or not. It would be excellent to see more people from the different ethnicities we see in church on Sunday come and express what they see as their place in the parish.

Over the next few weeks there will be the First Holy Communions of children from our parish schools.

For many of them it will be rare thing to be in church on a Sunday morning. It would be great if we could make them feel especially welcome and encourage them to find a regular place for the worship of God in the Mass. Many people say that they don't need to go to Mass, as they pray every day. It may well be the case that they do, but it is fundamentally un-Catholic to say this. We have the Eucharist, the very presence of Jesus Christ, among us. That is something which is essential to Catholic life. So, let us pray for a new awareness of the Eucharist, and pray for a Eucharistic renewal among Catholics.

Please also pray for the Deanery Eucharistic Congress which is happening next month, from 10th to 12th July, and please plan to be part of it!



Saint of the Week



St Hanibal Maria di Francia 1851-1927

Although born in a noble family, Hanibal was orphaned at the age of 2. This gave him a particular sensitivity towards orphans in his life. He was known, even as a boy, as very charitable. When he was a priest he saw his charity repaid by God's Provi-

dence many times over. He went to the poorest area of Messina to live with the poorest, and helped people materially and spiritually. People were suspicious of his motives, but he won through with faith. His motto was: "Double charity: evangelization and aid to the poor". He founded a women's community and orphanages.
