SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Lidwina 1380-1433

St Lidwina was a Dutch lay woman who belonged to a large poor family, made up mostly of boys. She made a vow of virginity in her teens. After a skating injury she became bedridden and suffered greatly. Helped by a priest, she was reconciled with her disability through meditation on

the Passion and became a 'victim soul' offering herself, through her frequent Communion, for the good of souls. As her infirmity grew, so did her mysticism and she had many strange experiences. Many came to her for healing and advice. When she died, her body became beautiful and became a popular intercessor for souls.

It is named after the document of Pope St Paul VI on evangelization from 1975. On this weekend, this year, there is a **National Eucharistic Congress** taking place at Oscott College. This is an event with limited participation. JUBILEE YEAR CONSECRATION TO THE SACRED HEART OF JESUS



The Year 2025 is the Great Year of Jubilee in the Church. These Jubilee Years happen every 25 years in commemoration of the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. This year we are keeping a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Jubilee Year.

The essence of the Jubilee is returning to Jesus Christ. Every one of us is called to return to Jesus in faith, and in consecration of our lives. It is a call for those who are firm in faith, as well as for those who are lax, or neglectful, or who have turned their back on Christ and his Church.

As Catholics, we return to Christ through penitence and prayer, through the Sacraments and a life of charity, shaped by the image of Christ being formed within us.

The image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is the greatest icon of his love and mercy, and of our consecration to Him in faith. The visions and promises made to St Margaret Mary are given again to us in our age.

Many will be aware of the practice of the nine First Fridays. This is a way of renewing the practice of a wellprepared for Holy Communion, through Confession of our sins, and a way of preparing to consecrate ourselves to Jesus.

Fr Julian is calling on everyone in Our Lady of Grace parish to join in celebrating the nine First Fridays, beginning in October and ending in June 2025 during the Jubilee Year. There will then be a novena of the Sacred Heart preparing for the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart on Friday 27th June when everyone is invited to consecrate themselves and our parish to Jesus' Sacred Heart.

PARISH FORUM

During the next couple of months, the Synod of Bishops will be meeting to continue their discussions about the future direction of the Catholic Church throughout the world. You'll remember your contribution to this, with the meetings which happened a couple of years ago. In a letter to the Archdiocese earlier this year, His Grace the Archbishop asked that every parish should have a 'Parish Council' so that the collegial approach should be at the heart of our parishes too.

This autumn we are going to go ahead and bring together a parish forum. It will not be a 'Council' with elected members, in the way these things worked in the past. The idea is not to become a democracy: a parish is always led by a priest. But, a priest needs support, help and the benefit of different views. And so the forum is to help us to work together to discover what God desires for us.

There will be planning meeting in early October to formulate what the forum should do, how often it should meet, and all the nitty-gritty. Then the first meeting will be on Sunday 17th November in the afternoon. Although parish groups will be represented, everyone is welcome to come to all or any of its meetings.
