A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

In the past, August was the great holiday month, and 'back to school' meant that parishioners returned after being away too. It is very noticeable, these days, that while August is a month of holiday for families, many retired people go away on their holidays in September. It means that the holiday period stretches into the autumn. In fact, the number in church during August was very much like normal in the rest of the year. As soon as September arrived, the number in church went down. It means that we have to be aware, not to start parish events or initiatives in September!

And so October becomes the month for starting new things, and getting back into our activity. You'll see, in this bulletin, that there are quite a few things going on over the next few weeks, as we get back into parish life.

It is exciting that, after a break of a few years, we have the Alpha course back on. It is taking place in St Margaret Ward Academy, and is available to teachers, parents, and parishioners alike. It is mainly aimed at people who are beginners with faith. That might not be you—but you might know people who fall into that category. Maybe you could invite them to go to the Alpha course, and go along with them?

We will soon be beginning our Parish preparation for Consecration to the Heart of Jesus, which will take place at the heart of the coming Jubilee Year. I hope that as many of you as possible will make the effort to observe the nine First Fridays (though in November it will be the second Friday so as not to

clash with All Saints' Day). The First Fridays were revealed to St Margaret Mary as a wonderful way to get people to take the sacramental life of the Church seriously, and for renewal in faith.

In the coming weeks we also have a healing service and prayer for vocations. Biddulph will join Goldenhill for the 'welcome space' initiative, providing a place of welcome and company with others.

I am very pleased that the new heating system in the presbytery has been completed. It took seven weeks, on and off, and the process was a little tiresome. Part of the work was to link the former presbytery boiler to the church boiler, to give double power to the heating at St Joseph's. I'm sure it will be noticed during the cold winter months ahead.

Saint of the Week



St Francis Jaccard 1799-1838

Francis, from Savoy in eastern France, went to become a member of the French Foreign Missions, and was ordained priest. In 1824 he was sent to Vietnam on mission. He was very successful at bringing many people to the Faith. He was arrested a number of times, but his ability

with languages meant he was able to gain his release. In 1838, however, the success of his mission led to him being arrested for a final time, and this time the authorities wanted to make an example of him. He was tortured, but refused to give up the Faith and his priesthood, and so was strangled to death. Canonised by John Paul II.

CHANGES TO CATHOLIC SCHOOLS

His Grace, the Archbishop, has put forward a vision for the development of the Catholic schools of the Archdiocese. Most of the schools are, by now, Academies, organised into Multi-Academy Companies (MAC). These schools are independent from the local authority, and receive funding directly from the government. Each MAC is governed by a Board of Directors, under the auspices of the Trustees of the Archdiocese. In our area, the nine schools—St Margaret Ward and all its feeder primaries—are organised as the Newman Catholic Collegiate, as you are probably aware. It is now about 10 years since this was founded. The Archbishop, advised by the Diocesan Department for Education, has decided that now is the time for these Academies to be reorganised by making Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts much bigger, and merging the present MACs into them. This will be done gradually across the Diocese, beginning with our area—the north.

And so, the proposal is that, from 1st September 2025, all the schools in the whole of Staffordshire (including Stoke-on-Trent), Wolverhampton and the Black Country will merge into the first of these much larger Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts (it will have a proper name in due course, but at present is called CMAT1). This will make a Catholic Multi-Academy Trust with 63 schools (10 secondary and 53 primary), with over 21,500 pupils.

The Board of Directors, together with the present Senior Executive Leader of the Newman Catholic Collegiate, Ian Beardmore, have prepared a letter for all who are concerned with this change, including the people of the parishes covered by Collegiate. It is part of the consultation process, and the Archdiocese would like to hear any feedback concerning the new CMAT.
