A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



I'm back from Medjugorje after my first pilgrimage of the month! I set myself to do this month of pilgrimage as a way of remembering my mum and sister who died earlier in the year, and to pray for all sorts of intentions.

I had always had the intention of going to Medjugorje on pilgrimage, but had never got around to it. I had refused a couple of opportunities in the recent past, but this time I was asked shortly after my mum's passing away, and saw no reason to say no. And so, off I went with a group of 47 pilgrims, a mixture from Latin America and England, with a priest from Mexico for a week. I didn't know what to expect, and I didn't know what to make of the visionaries and all of that side of it, but I had a great pilgrimage.

It is impossible to describe it all, but I can tell you the highlights. Certainly, the experience, as a priest, of hearing so many confessions (in English, Spanish and French in my case) was very satisfying. Climbing the two hills-the hill of apparitions and Cross hill-was exhausting but very emotional. Sunday Mass with a beautiful healing service at the shrine of the Divine Mercy in a nearby village was also

emotional for many in the group. And the experience of being with the others and sharing time together... I was also able to offer Mass for my mum on what would have been her 96th birthday, and felt especially close to her there.

Now I'm back for ten days before going next Saturday evening to complete the Camino to Santiago. It's another strenuous pilgrimage, but another place I feel called to return to. This time with a smaller pilgrim group from our parish. Please pray for us, as we pray for you. While I'm away Fr Kevin Stokes will be looking after you, for Sunday Mass and All Saints' Day. Please have a look at all the things that are going on. I would like to invite you all particularly to the schools' Vocations Mass on 22nd October.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Bl Jakob Kern 1897-1924

Jakob was a young man from Austria. When expecting him, his mother prayed to Our Lady, and in return would ask Jesus to make him a priest. During childhood he was convinced of his vocation to the priesthood. However, on finishing school, he enlisted for the army, and was made a lieutenant and served in south Austria in the First World War. He maintained his piety, especially Eucharistic Adoration, and asked for a share in the sufferings of Christ. After the army, he went to seminary, and became a priest. After a year he became very sick and died the following year during surgery.

Holy Souls The month of November is the month of the Holy Souls, when we pray for our dearly departed brethren. Saturday 2nd November is All Souls' Day, dedicated to the prayer for all the faithful departed. There will be additional Masses for the day, as you can see in the list of Masses. We will also be making our annual list of the dead in each church. Please take one (or more) of the forms provided for listing your beloved dead. Please place these in one of the November List envelopes together with an offering—which goes to provide for the daily Masses for the Holy Souls, and other Masses through the year. Then place the envelope in the November List prayer intention box, available from next Sunday. **Note:** Offerings placed in the 'November List' envelope go towards the communal Masses for the dead. If you wish to have a particular Mass said (of which there are fewer available in the month), please use one of the normal Mass offering envelopes.

Solemnity of All Saints This feast day is on Friday 1st November, and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. Everyone should make every effort to be at Mass on this day. The Masses in our parish for the Holy Day are: Thursday 31st at 6.30pm at St Patrick's; Friday 1st at 9.15am at English Martyrs' and at 6.30pm at St Joseph's.

New Sunday Missal As you no doubt realise, the Lectionary or Book of Readings for Mass is changing on the First Sunday of Advent. This means that all people's missals will be out of date, and need to be replaced. CTS are taking orders for Sunday Missals to be delivered later this month. The cost of the missal is $\pounds 20$. Ordering through the parish benefits the parish as we receive a commission. If you would like to order a missal please sign up in church, or send an email to Teresa in the parish office. The order will be placed on Monday 21st October. CTS have still not given details of weekday or full daily missals.

New Lectionaries The new lectionaries for use in our churches from the beginning of Advent have arrived! Thank you to all who contributed to their purchase. Teresa, the Parish Secretary, will be contacting donors to see what inscription they would like in the volume they have donated.

Sacramental Preparation The preparation for First Confession (Y3) and First Holy Communion (Y4) will begin in our parish schools after half term. If you have a child who is not in one of our schools, and you would like them prepared for the sacraments this year, please see Fr Julian or email the parish office before the end of this half term.

First Friday The First Friday is 1st November, but because of the Holy Day, we will keep the First Friday with devotions to the Sacred Heart on Friday 8th November, as part of our preparation for consecration of the Parish to the Sacred Heart.
