A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



I am writing this, having just heard the result of the assisted suicide Bill in the House of Commons. It is a great shame that it seems that there is a desire to bring euthanasia to our country. However much the proponents say that there won't be a slippery slope, it is inevitable, as this is something which always happens with these 'progressive' moral issues. Once the general principle is accepted, then all hell breaks loose. We only have to look at the situation in

Canada, Belgium, Holland...

We can take a certain amount of consolation from the fact that both of our MPs—David Williams for Stoke North and Karen Bradley for Staffs Moorlands-both voted against at this stage. And we also have to remember that this is only the first stage of the parliamentary process. There is a committee stage and third reading in the Commons, and then the House of Lords still to begin their work. So let us keep praying for the defence of the sanctity of life.

When we begin the season of Advent, we don't hear about the coming of Christmas in the liturgy at all. In fact, it is mostly about preparing for the final judgement. We are urged to live lives which distinguish us in holiness and justice, in truth and

love, from the rest of the human race. So let us take the cue from the liturgy, and commit ourselves to living lives exemplary in the way in which they honour the sacred nature of human life. It may be that the Catholic Church becomes one of the few places where that sanctity of life will still be defended and proclaimed. And it begins with the way in which each of us deals with the lives of others—the poor, the sick, the elderly, the terminally ill, mothers in crisis pregnancies—and with how we honour the sanctity of our own lives.

So let us be joyful in the Lord and be of good cheer. The Lord is with us always. But one question I put before you: Can we leave the Christmas celebrations until Christmas actually arrives, and keep a good and holy Advent?

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Alexander Briant 1556-1581

St Alexander was born in Somerset and educated at Oxford University, where he converted to Catholicism. This meant he had to leave the University, and from there he went to Reims to join the English seminary there. He was ordained priest in 1578 and returned to England, going

back to Somerset to work on the Catholic mission. He was able to minister for three years before he was arrested and sent to the Tower of London. He was subjected to torture to reveal the names of other Catholic priests. In November 1581 he was condemned to death. He was again tortured, which hastened his death.
