#### A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

I am away this weekend, as I am in Valladolid in Spain at the English College, where I did my training for the priesthood. Saturday is the Feast of Our Lady Vulnerata, the Patroness of the Seminary, being the name of an image of Our Lady which is 'wounded' hacked about and dragged through the streets of Seville—by English Protestant sailors in the late sixteenth century. The image was brought to the English College so that the seminarians could make acts of reparation for the offence given to Our Lady, and for the way in which England and Wales had turned their backs on the Faith of our Fathers. As the Honorary Secretary of the Old Boys' Association, I will be representing the alumni of the College at the Feast Day.

We are getting very close

to the beginning of the Jubilee Year. It is almost upon us! The Holy Father will open the Holy Door at St Peter's Basilica on Christmas Eve marking the beginning of the Jubilee which extends to Epiphany 2026.

During this Jubilee Year, we should make every effort to place Jesus Christ at the centre of our lives. That begins with the life of the Church itself. I have already invited you to prepare to make a consecration—both personal and of the Parish—to the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the Feast Day in June. Please consider starting to make the nine first Fridays—it's never too late! You can start on the first Friday of January.

Another initiative which I have had the inspiration for, and which has been accepted by the Archbish-

op, Auxiliary Bishop, the Dean and the local clergy, is to have a Eucharistic Congress for North Staffs. I am hoping that other deaneries in Staffordshire will join us too. It will be taking place from Thursday 10th to Saturday 12th July. A Eucharistic Congress is a moment in the life of the Church when we stop in order to deepen our knowledge and faith in Jesus, present in the Eucharist, and to celebrate and adore. I will give you more details about it in January. There will be an Opening Mass celebrated by the Archbishop, a day for schools, and a day for parishioners ending with Mass and a Eucharistic Procession. It will take place at Sacred Heart Tunstall, and St Margaret Ward. It will take quite some work, and so I shall look to parishioners to help and support!

### SAINT OF THE WEEK



#### St Maria di Rosa 1813-1855

Daughter of a wealthy industrialist and conventeducated, Maria became manager in a cotton spinning mill at 19. She noticed the poor state of many of the female workers and became determined to help them. For the next 10 years, she remained at home getting involved in

social work. In response to a cholera epidemic, Maria began gathering a group of women who were to care for the sick and poor. These she called the Handmaids of Charity, eventually becoming a religious order. She once said "I suffer from seeing suffering", and this motivated her throughout the rest of her short life.

Safeguarding & Health & Safety Please ensure that children remain safe at all times around our churches. Would all parents and guardians observe the following norms. 1. Children should be accompanied at all times around the church property. They should be accompanied if they

go to the toilet (this is especially true at English Martyrs' and St Patrick's where the toilets are at the back of church, and not observable from the body of the church. 2. Please also ensure that children do not run around in church at any time, either during Mass or afterwards. There are a lot of things they can collide with, such as votive candle stands, hot radiators, pews... 3. Please ensure that children are properly supervised lighting votive candles. Everyone should use the tapers provided and not light one candle from another. Do not reach across lighted candles to place a candle on the stand. Remember that most coats etc are made of highly flammable materials.

Advent Penitential Service The Penitential Service for our Parish together with Tunstall, Burslem and Norton will take place at St Joseph's Goldenhill on Friday 20th December. There will be a selection of priests available to hear confessions that night.

Rorate Mass It is traditional in some countries of Europe to have a Rorate Mass on Saturdays in Advent. It is a Mass of Our Lady, celebrated by candlelight before sunrise, to end as the sun rises. It shows how Our Lady is the herald of the new dawn of our salvation. We will celebrate a Rorate Mass on Saturday 21st December at 7.15am at St Joseph's followed by breakfast. A great way to honour Our Lady of Grace!
