A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

A very Happy Feast of Candlemas! Today is traditionally the last day of Christmas, as we celebrate Jesus presented in the Temple. For most people Christmas is already a distant memory. Today's feast brings to mind the meaning of Christmas and Epiphany, as we celebrate Jesus who is the Light of the World entering the

sanctuary of the Temple. It is this Temple that—in the words of Jesus' own prophecy—would be torn down to be replaced by the New Temple which is his body.

The light entering the dark of the Temple makes us think of light entering the temple of our bodies, of our lives. The light of



Christ enters within us when we are enlightened by faith. During this year of Jubilee, we should make every effort to allow the light of Christ to enter our lives in a new and fresh way. We can do this very simply by applying ourselves once again to prayer and the reading of Scripture. We can take up the

catechism and be surprised by the depth and beauty of the Faith. In our parish we have the opportunity to hear the basic Gospel message by taking the Alpha course (a new Alpha is starting soon). We can also apply ourselves to learning to read the Bible, and to pray in new and varied ways, and live more like Christ through the

Prayer & Life Workshops. Again, there will be a new series of workshops running in the parish soon. The invitation of the Jubilee Year is the invitation of faith.

Saint of the Week



St Joan de Lestonnac 1556-1640

Joan was from Bordeaux, and married at 17, having four children. Her husband died when she was 41. When the children were adults, Joan entered the Cistercian monastery in Toulouse, but left because of poor health. She felt called to found a new Order and was joined by sev-

eral young women. They ministered to victims of the plague which was raging at the time. She was also determined to counter the heresies of Calvin, which were gaining traction in the area. The Order she founded was recognised by the Archbishop, and Joan became first superior. Healings are attributed to her intercession.

PARISH PASTORAL FORUM

These are just the summary minutes for the meeting on 20th January

1. Minutes of Previous Planning Meeting

Minutes were distributed and agreed.

Training for readers on the new lectionary has taken place.

Election of Officers

 Fr Julian's Address

Emphasised inclusivity — no elections for committee roles to ensure participation is open to all. Recognised the need for greater representation across age groups and ethnic diversity, particularly in Goldenhill. The Parish's primary purpose is spiritual growth, aiming to build a vibrant faith community. Encouraging evangelisation — currently, 10 individuals are receiving instruction in the faith, including young men, which is a positive development. Support from Parishioners is essential for those undergoing faith formation and beyond.

4. Safeguarding

An action plan has been developed to ensure safeguarding measures are in place. **Key actions:** Ensuring all those working with children and vulnerable adults have a DBS check. Volunteers to complete volunteer information forms. A DBS database has been created. A safeguarding risk assessment template will be provided for all Parish groups. Monthly safeguarding meetings to be held, with a lead and deputy appointed. The Parish has been noted as an example of good practice at a BDES meeting.

5. Reports from Parish Groups represented *Foodbank*

Aldi pick-ups take place six days a week and are distributed to other charities. Before Christmas: 25 vouchers were given out, feeding 75 people. The average number supported is around 8. *Alpha Course*

A new Alpha course is set to launch. Dates and details to follow. *Warm and Welcoming Spaces*

Held at English Martyrs and St Joseph's. Attendance has been affected by bad weather. Funding sources: English Martyrs – funded by the local Town Council. St Joseph's – funded by volunteers and attendees.

Fr Hudson's Group

Membership: 38 members, 3 leaders, 5 volunteers. Meets monthly, with a £3 contribution requested. Various activities take place, including an annual summer trip.

Prayer and Life Workshop

A parish PLW will launch soon. Currently training new guides. **Rosary Group**

Efforts are underway to establish a Rosary group at Biddulph.

6. Parish Brochure

A Parish brochure is needed to highlight all activities within the Parish. Possible involvement of younger Parishioners in designing the brochure was suggested. Elena Johnson has agreed to take on the role of managing social media for the Parish.

7. Ministry to the Sick and Housebound

There is a need to identify and reach out to Parishioners who are unable to attend Mass. Volunteers appointed to establish a list of those needing visits, phone calls and Holy Communion: Gill

Hodgkinson (Kidsgrove); Gill Hussey (Packmoor); Pat Potts (Goldenhill); Biddulph – TBC

8. Building up our Community in Faith

A discussion about how to encourage more people to gather and pray. It was suggested hosting prayer meetings in homes would be a good way to increase participation. SPUC meetings currently take place in Hanley there is encouragement for more Parishioners to join.

9. Fundraising and Social Events

A new group will focus on planning key social and fundraising events. The Ladies Group volunteered to take the lead, with the condition that they seek additional help as needed.

A discussion on improving Parish communication took place with a suggestion to distribute information via email through the Parish Office, ensuring compliance with GDPR.

Parish Census planned for Spring 2025, which will allow email contact lists to be updated.
