A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

After our two great celebrations for Candlemas and our Patroness, Our Lady of Grace, we return this week to the Sundays of Ordinary Time, as we await the beginning of Lent. This week I am going to be away for a post-Christmas/pre-Lent break. It is also half term in our schools.

I am sure you have been following the updates on the closure of St John's church. Today is my last update. On Friday of this last week, the whole process came to an end as the Church, Presbytery and School at the The Avenue were finally sold to the Coptic Orthodox Church. The sale was completed at lunchtime, and I went to hand over all the keys to Fr Bishoy. He is very keen that the history of St John's is not forgotten, and wants to welcome parishioners any time that you wish to

visit the Church for any reason. It would be good to have an opportunity for us to go and attend their celebration of the liturgy together one Saturday morning.

It is still sad for many of our parishioners that St John's had to close but I hope that you, like me, take consolation in the fact that it is still a church dedicated to the Christian worship of God, and that it is being looked after as such.

As we continue our celebration of the Jubilee Year, it would be good, also, to plan to visit one of the pilgrimage churches in our Diocese, each of which has a Holy Door. The Jubilee pilgrimage churches in Birmingham Archdiocese are: St Chad's Cathedral; St Anne's church, Caversham; Our Lady of Lourdes, Hednesford; St Michael's church, Penn,



Wolverhampton; Shrine of Our Lady of Evesham; Harvington Hall; the College at Littlemore, Oxford.

As we prepare for Lent in this Jubilee Year, let us prepare ourselves with the intention to make this a great Lent! It is good to be thinking already of what we can do to make this Lent a time of renewal for our lives, through prayer, charity and penitence. Remember Ash Wednesday is very soon: 5th March.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Alexis Falconieri 1200-1310

Alexis, a wealthy Florentine, was the founder of the Servite Order. In 1233, on the Feast of the Assumption, together with his companions, he experienced a vision of Our Lady. This is what inspired them to found the new Order founded on a life of prayer. All of his companions were ordained priests, but Alexis refused, deeming himself unworthy. He helped to build their church near to Florence, and was the administrator of the Order. When the Order was officially approved by the Pope Alexis was the only founder still alive. He lived to the age of 110, and died at Monte Scenario.
