A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Today is St Chad's Day, the great Bishop of Mercia and patron saint of our Archdiocese. It was St Chad who established his See in Lichfield in the 7th century. With the restoration of the Catholic hierarchy in 1850, the Diocese of

Birmingham and its Bishop became the spiritual heirs of St Chad. Chad was chosen to be Bishop of Mercia, the ancient kingdom of central England, having been deposed as Bishop of York, due to anomalies in his ordination as a Bishop. He stood down willingly with tremendous humility, willing to return to his monastery. This humility was recognised by Archbishop Theodore of Canterbury, who had him appointed Bishop in the newly evangelized central kingdom of England.

St Chad is a great example of humility, but also of apostolic zeal and fervent prayer. He preferred to visit his Diocese on foot, going from village to village, but was persuaded to ride a horse to preserve his strength. We should ask St Chad for the gift of such humility and zeal for our bishops and priests today, as well as for all Catholics in our Archdiocese, for without these gifts our mission will not succeed.

This week we begin our annual time of renewal of grace: Lent. On Wednesday you are invited to come and receive the blessed ashes as the outward sign of your willingness of heart to repent and be converted. Lent is a time for those preparing for baptism, asking that their hearts be freed from sin and be prepared for Christ. For those who are baptized, it is the time for asking for the graces of our baptism to be renewed in us. It is the time when we should be returning to the Lord through Confession of our sins, through renewed reading the Gospel and prayer, and through penitential practices. Let us pray for a good Lent!

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Teresa Verzeri 1801-1852

From an early age Ignazia Verzeri wanted to serve God. Coming from a very Catholic family, the parents wanted to support the vocations of their children. Her education was placed under the care of Mgr Benaglio and she studied with Benedictine nuns. In 1831, she founded the Daughters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, a congregation which would focus on girls and their education. On her profession, she took the name Teresa Eustochio. She worked hard to establish orphanages for girls as well as providing support for the aged and the sick. Her congregation grew in all continents after her death.

Ash Wednesday This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, and is a day of fasting and abstinence. Fasting means eating no more than one full meal and is obligatory for all Catholics aged 18 to 59. Abstinence means eating no meat, and is binding on all Catholics aged over 14, with no upper limit. Ashes will be given at all Masses and Liturgies of the Word on that day (see opposite).

Lent in the Jubilee Year 2025

Every year, the Holy Father issues a message for Lent. Here are some highlights from this year's message of Pope Francis:

This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to *journey together in hope*, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, *to journey*. The Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", evokes the lengthy journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land [...] A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity?

Second, to journey *together*. The Church is called to walk together [...] Let us all walk in the same direction, tending towards the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience. This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs. Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance.

Third, let us journey together *in hope*, for we have been given a promise. May *the hope that does not disappoint*, the central message of the Jubilee, be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. This, then, is the third call to conversion: a call to hope, to trust in God and his great promise of eternal life. Let us ask ourselves: Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?

May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey. +++FRANCIS PP
