A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

I guess that not many of you had heard of Cardinal Robert Prevost before last Thursday. I had, but did not really know much about him. He seems to have had a pathway to the Papacy unlike most. He has lived most of his life as a missionary and in pastoral life as a priest and bishop in Peru, and only recently came to Rome to be one of the Pope's helpers in the Curia, and had only been a cardinal for 18 months.

The first few days of his Pontificate have brought great appreciation from everyone. He seems to be a bit like the previous three Popes in different ways. He is an Augustinian, and I was taught theology by Augustinians. His way of

thought seems very similar to Pope Benedict XVI. His simple approach to people seems very like Pope John Paul II and Pope Francis. It will be good to see how his pontificate develops, but the signs are good. Of

course, this is the honeymoon period, and he will have his problems. But let us all join in real prayer for the Pope and real joy in his election.

For priests the biggest challenge is to remember to put the correct name in the Eucharistic Prayer. I was pleased to be able to celebrate Mass last Sunday in Our Lady of the Angels church in Cala Millor in Mallorca. I was pleased to be able to help the parish priest out, even if I was on holiday. It is a good reminder to make Mass part of our holiday, or when we are on a visit or trip somewhere. These days, it's easy, with the internet, to look up Mass times and locations. It's good to see how Catholic (universal) the Church is!

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Pope St John I
470-526

John was elected Pope while still a deacon. He became Pope in a time when the Roman Empire had split. The Byzantine emperor had become a heretic (Arian) but he was then succeeded by a new Emperor. The Roman Emperor sent John on a mission to ensure that the her-

etics were treated fairly in Byzantium fearing repercussions on the Catholics. He was successful in his mission. However, the Roman Emperor became suspicious of Pope John fearing that he would side with his rival. He had him imprisoned in Ravenna, and John died shortly afterwards, due to the bad treatment he received.

Glory be... (seven times for the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit)

Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Christ Jesus, before ascending into heaven, you promised to send the Holy Spirit to your apostles and disciples. Grant that the same Spirit may perfect in our lives the work of your grace and love. Grant us the Spirit of fear of the Lord that we may be filled with loving reverence toward you; the Spirit of piety that we might find peace and fulfilment in the service of God while serving others; the Spirit of fortitude that we may bear our cross with you and, with courage overcome the obstacles that interfere with our salvation; the Spirit of knowledge that we may know you and know ourselves and grow in holiness; the Spirit of understanding to enlighten our minds with the light of your truth; the Spirit of counsel that we may choose the surest way of doing your will, seeking first the kingdom. Grant us the Spirit of wisdom that we may aspire to the things that last forever. Teach us to be your faithful disciples and animate us in every way with your Spirit. Amen.

Give me grace O Holy Spirit, Spirit of the Father and the Son to say to You always and everywhere, "Speak Lord for Your servant listens." Amen.

DEANERY & BEYOND

Come to His Eucharistic Heart is the name of our Deanery Eucharistic Congress taking place from 10th to 12th July. The programme will begin with a Deanery Jubilee Year Mass celebrated by His Grace, the Archbishop on Thursday 10th July at Sacred Heart Church, Tunstall at 7pm. This will be followed by the opening of the Congress with a talk, a Holy Hour, and all-night Eucharistic Adoration. The Friday will be a programme for schools in which all the Catholic Schools of North Staffordshire are invited to participate. This will take place in each school with parts of the day shared through live streaming. On Friday evening, we invite all parishioners to come for the opening of the conference part of the Congress. There will be Mass, a talk, and Holy Hour and once again all night Adoration. The Congress continues on Saturday with a full programme of talks, workshops and times of prayer, ending with Mass and a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament presided over by Bishop Timothy Menezes.
