A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



We are now at the halfway point in the Jubilee Year which calls us to be Pilgrims of Hope. You will remember that, last October, we began the nine First Fridays, and a few parishioners have made it to the end of the nine! The idea was for that to be a preparation for a Consecration of the Parish to the Sacred Heart of Jesus at the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart. In the heart of the Jubilee Year, which celebrates another 25 years

since the Incarnation of God-made-Man, Jesus Christ our Lord, we consecrate ourselves, our families and our Parish to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. So I am asking all parishioners to pray the Novena of the Sacred Heart. If you go to the back page of this Bulletin you will find the prayers for each day. On the final day of the Novenathe eve of the Sacred Heart—we will have a Holy Hour of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament at St Joseph's to make the Consecration all together. I really would like to have people together from all across the Parish, and in good numbers, to pray together and consecrate our parish to the Sacred Heart of that evening, Thursday 26th June.

The following day we will have Mass at 5pm, so that I can make it to the Mass later in the evening at Our Lady & St Werburgh's Clayton for the Golden Jubilee of my good friend Fr Anton Madej SCJ. As a Sacred Heart Father, it is a most appropriate evening to celebrate his jubilee, so please pray for him.

Next week will be our main First Communion Sunday, as well as the Solemnity of Corpus Christi. Please pray for the children who are receiving their First Holy Communion this year.

There is one change that I want to make you aware of. I have changed my weekly day off to Monday. As I am expanding the work I am doing in promoting priestly fraternities, that is the day which I will dedicate to that. There will still be evening Mass if I am in Stoke on Monday, but there won't be if I am elsewhere.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St Germaine Cousin 1579-1601

Germaine was a French girl who was weak and disabled. When her mother died, her step-mother treated her appallingly and abusively. She worked as a shepherdess, and she was made to sleep in a stable on the floor and was underfed. Instead of turning to resentment or anger, Germaine embraced spiritual humility and practised the presence of God in her solitude. She assisted at Holy Mass each day, regular confession, and loved the Blessed Sacrament and Our Lady. She offered her sufferings and prayers in reparation for the sacrileges of heretics in neighbouring churches. She died at the age of 22.
