A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST




The Rosary is one of those 'iconic' images which reminds us of our Faith. It represents Catholicism. And many people have a Rosary, give Rosaries as gifts, buy Rosaries at shrines, or display them in their homes and cars. Some people think it is a necklace to be worn. But the Rosary is much more than an icon or symbol of our Catholic Faith. It is truly a lifeline. Or better still, it is like a

rope ladder which Our Lady drops down from heaven, to help us climb up. So often, the Rosary ends out being a charm or a like a piece of jewellery. But the Rosary is dead unless it is picked up and used for prayer. We should easily turn to the Rosary in our daily lives as the prayer which brings us closer to Jesus through Mary. The great mysteries of the life of Jesus are meditated up-

on as we turn to Our Lady to support our prayer with hers

So my appeal to you this October is to pick up your Rosary and pray it. You have no idea how powerful it is! We say how much we desire peace in the world. Pray the Rosary. We say how much we want our families to have the Faith that we have. Pray the Rosary. We find it difficult to turn from our sins. Pray the Rosary. The Rosary is such an effective tool to bring our spiritual life to the fore, especially if we have neglected it.

St Anna Schaeffer 1882-1925

Born of a poor family, Anna dropped out of school aged 14 hoping to join a religious order. Aged 16, she received a vision of the Lord who told her she would have long and painful suffering. She went to work at a laundry. When she was 19 she had an accident, where she slipped

and fell in the boiling water of the washing machine, severely burning her legs. She went through 30 surgical operations, with no success. She bore all her sufferings with patience, and with deep devotion to the Sacred Heart and to the Blessed Mother. She received the stigmata, esctasies and visions. She finally died of colon cancer.

The good news is that the larger number of speakers in the debates in the House of Lords have been against the Bill. It is more difficult to get in touch with members of the House of Lords, as they do not have constituencies.
