A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST

As I have often said in the past, although we keep May and October as the months dedicated to Our Lady, September is a remarkably Marian month. During the month we celebrate the Nativity, or Birthday, of Our Lady on 8th, the Holy Name of Mary on 12th, Our Lady of Sorrows on 15th, and, in England, we celebrate Our Lady of Walsingham (and also Our Lady of Ransom) on 24th.

Walsingham would, no doubt, have been a great international shrine had the Reformation never happened. As it is, our national shrine of Our Lady is far smaller than the great shrines of Lourdes, Fatima, Medjugorje... However, it is a very spiritual place, and should be at the heart



of our Catholic consciousness in this country. When I was there on retreat during August, it was a shame to see that very few casual English pilgrims turned up, compared to the huge number of day pilgrims from the Tamil immigrant population. If you do not know about Our Lady of Walsingham, or if the de-

votion does not mean a great deal to you, then I invite you to come on Wednesday to celebrate the feast day. There is Mass in the morning at St Joseph's and then a Deanery Mass in the evening at Our Lady & Peter's Stoke. North Staffs is already notable for having one of the most active Walsingham Associations in the country, and our pilgrimage this August was one of

the largest residential pilgrimages they have at the shrine. As Our Lady of Walsingham has been key in my vocation journey, so I invite you to celebrate the feast, and to consider coming on next year's pilgrimage, or to join the local Association and its activities throughout the year.

Saint of the Week



St Thomas Thien 1820-1838

Thomas was one of the Vietnamese martyrs whose feast is celebrated together each year. Thomas' father died when he was 10, and the local priest took over his upbringing and education to get him ready to go to seminary. He entered the seminary in Di Loan when he reached 18. This

coincided with the persecution by the king. Thomas was arrested and brutally beaten, and threatened worse should he not give up the Faith. He just said that he preferred to be beheaded than to give up the true God. This 18 year old seminarian was further tortured and hanged. He was canonised by Pope St John Paul II in 1988.

The purpose of this public call is to gather information from anyone who has had recent contact with the Archdiocese of Birmingham, or any other Diocese or RLG. This includes experiences that are new or ongoing, as well as those connected to non-recent abuse, both in a faith context and outside of faith. While the primary focus is the period from July 2024 onwards, the CSSA do not wish to limit what survivors choose to share.
