A WORD FROM THE PARISH PRIEST



Yesterday, our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV proclaimed St John Henry Newman as the 38th Doctor of the Church. A Doctor of the Church is a saint recognised not just for their holiness, but for the particular wisdom of their teaching of the Faith, and set up as an example of clear and original thought. You can read the Holy Father's words on the back page of

the bulletin. This is a great day for our Diocese, because, as you know, Cardinal Newman lived here, firstly in Oxford, as an Anglican, and then afterwards in Birmingham as a Catholic Oratorian priest and later Cardinal. He was created a Cardinal of the Roman Church by Pope Leo XIII, and now declared a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIV.

I remember praying for the canonisation of Cardinal Newman back when I was a student when I became a Catholic. How all those prayers have been answered! He was beatified by Pope Benedict XVI at Cofton Park in Birmingham, and canonised by Pope Francis in Rome, and is now recognised as a teacher of the Faith for all the nations, as a Doctor of the Church. Let us continue to ask his intercession.

On Wednesday evening I received the very sad news that Fr Simon Hall had died the previous evening in Royal Stoke. For those who did not know him, he was the priest at St Teresa's Church in Trent Vale, and had been there for a couple of years. I first knew Simon when he was still in sixth form, when I was on a placement as a seminarian in King's Heath, Birmingham, and we became friends. Simon entered seminary at Oscott at 18, and gave faithful service to the Church ever since. He read the first reading at my Ordination Mass. I was there in King's Heath for his ordination too. I used to drop in to see him and he was always warm and welcoming. He had a great heart and was a wonderful priest. He will be sadly missed. May he rest in peace.

SAINT OF THE WEEK



Bl John Bodey 1549-1583

John was born in Wells, Somerset, and was educated at Winchester and Oxford. He was made a fellow of New College, Oxford, but was expelled by the Bishop when he became a Catholic. He went to Douai College, the seminary in France, and studied Law. When he returned he was appointed as a schoolmaster in Hampshire. He was arrested two years later and put into prison in iron shackles accused of high treason. He said, "If you make the hearing of Mass treason, or the saying of a Hail Mary treason, then you may make what you please treason". He was hanged, drawn and quartered at Andover.

Update of Assisted Dying Bill

For those who keep up with the news, you will know that the Bill (called the Terminally Ill Adults End of Life Bill) which allows assisted suicide passed the House of Commons and is now in the House of Lords. The good news is that the larger number of speakers in the debates in the House of Lords have been against the Bill. It is more difficult to get in touch with members of the House of Lords, as they do not have constituencies. However, please do try to contact any that you know of in order to voice opposition to the Bill. ST JOHN HENRY NEWMAN, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

"Having obtained the opinions of many brothers in the Episcopate and of many of the faithful throughout the world, and having consulted the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints, and through sure knowledge and mature deliberation, and in virtue of the fulness of Apostolic power, we declare St John Henry Newman a Doctor of the Universal Church.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." (Pope Leo XIV)

On this Solemnity of All Saints, it is a great joy to inscribe Saint John Henry Newman among the Doctors of the Church and, at the same time, on the occasion of the Jubilee of World Education, to name him co-patron, together with Saint Thomas Aquinas, of all those involved in education. Newman's imposing cultural and spiritual stature will serve as an inspiration to new generations with hearts thirsting for the infinite, ready to undertake, through research and knowledge, that journey which, as the ancients said, takes us *per aspera ad astra*, that is, through difficulties to the stars.

The lives of the saints testify to us, in fact, that it is possible to live passionately amid the complexity of the present, without neglecting the apostolic mandate: "Shine today like stars in the world" (*Phil 2:15*). On this solemn occasion, I wish to repeat to educators and educational institutions: "Shine today like stars in the world," thanks to the authenticity of your commitment to the concerted search for truth, in its coherent and generous sharing, through service to young people, especially the poor, and in the daily experience that "Christian love is prophetic, it works miracles". [...]

We bring to mind one of Saint John Henry's best-known texts, the hymn Lead, kindly light. In that beautiful prayer, we realize that we are far from home, that our feet are wavering, that we cannot clearly decipher the horizon. But none of this holds us back, because we have found the Guide: "Lead me, O kindly Light, through the darkness that surrounds me, be You the One to lead me! — Lead, kindly Light. The night is dark and I am far from home. Lead Thou me on! ». It is the task of education to offer this Gentle Light to those who might otherwise remain imprisoned by the particularly insidious shadows of pessimism and fear. For this reason I would like to say to you: let us disarm the false reasons for resignation and impotence, and let us circulate in the contemporary world the great reasons for hope. Let us contemplate and point to constellations that transmit light and direction in this present darkened by so many injustices and uncertainties. [...]

Among the enduring legacies of St. John Henry are, in this sense, some very significant contributions to the theory and practice of education. "God," he wrote, "has created me to render him a specific service. He has entrusted me with a task he has entrusted to no other. I have a mission: I may not know it in this life, but it will be revealed to me in the next" (*Meditations and Devotions*, III, I, 2). In these words, we find beautifully expressed the mystery of the dignity of every human person and also that of the variety of gifts distributed by God.

Life is illuminated not because we are rich or beautiful or powerful. It is illuminated when we discover this truth within ourselves: I am called by God, I have a vocation, I have a mission, my life serves something greater than myself! Every single creature has a role to play. The contribution each person has to offer is of unique value, and the task of educational communities is to encourage and enhance that contribution. Let us not forget: at the heart of educational programs must be not abstract individuals, but real people, especially those who appear to be underperforming, according to the parameters of an economy that excludes and kills. We are called to form people, so that they may shine like stars in their full dignity.
